sian governments in expanding the scope of cooperation between the two countries through signed agreements on trade expansion, education, culture and arts exchange, and defense and security. On behalf of the Philippine business community present, Mr. Ang stressed the importance of the private sector further contributing to the valuable friendship and growing respect between the two countries.

The Minister presented updates on Malaysia-ASEAN investment relations and updates on industry developments in Malaysia. In turn, the representatives of the Philippine private sector responded favorably to Malaysian investment prospects and agreed to invest in other parts of Malaysia, such as Sarawak and Sabah. To add to the discussion, Mr. Ang pointed out that, presently, Malaysian business and trade interests in the Philippines are mainly vested in and concentrated on the infrastructure, hotel and gaming, and food & beverages sectors. However he still expressed optimism that "[Malaysian] investments will increase and move into other sectors."

A Malaysian Trade and Investment Mission on products and services was likewise held in conjunction with the Minister's Philippine visit. 12 Malaysian companies involved in infrastructure, information & communication technology, and specialized services joined the Minister in a specialized marketing mission at the Fairmont Hotel in Makati City, organized by MATRADE Manila.





